Universal Church

Dec 12 The Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith released *Dignitas personae*, its first comprehensive instruction on bioethics since *Donum vitae* in 1987. The instruction applies moral principles to new issues and situations that have arisen from biotechnology over the past two decades, based on respect for the human being from the moment of conception and respect for the transmission of life within the spousal union.

Diocese of Columbus

A parish self-study was launched early in the year. Purposes were to educate parishioners on current conditions in their parish; to provide means for involvement of the faithful in charting the course of the local Church; to develop strategies to address changing demographic and economic factors; and to help in living the mission of the Church by proclaiming and preaching the Gospel. Target for beginning implementation is June, 2009.

Parishes

Jan. 20 A new organ was dedicated at St. Christopher Parish, Columbus.
June 28 Bishop Campbell blessed the new, though unfinished, Parish Activities Center at St. Paul Parish, Westerville.
July 27 A new organ was dedicated at St. Margaret of Cortona Parish, Columbus.
A new steeple was installed on St. John the Baptist Church, Columbus.

The interior of St. Thomas Aquinas Church in Zanesville was renovated with new sanctuary furnishings, tiled slate floor, paint, and new niches for statues of the Blessed Virgin Mary and St. Thomas in the original side altar spaces.

The Jesuit Fathers withdrew from the Community of Holy Rosary and St. John, Columbus.

A new bell tower with three bells was installed at Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church in Grove City.

Death of Jo McShane, 1888

The body of Joseph McShane was found in a corn field adjoining the Soldier's Home at Dayton the Saturday after Christmas. He had died in all probability on Christmas day as this was the last seen of him. Many of our people remember Jo well. For a number of years he drove the express wagon from St. Joseph's to Somerset in the days of St. Joseph's College. He was a kind hearted man but the appetite for strong drink overcame him, but outside of this he had not a fault. Should this notice meet the eye of any of the old College boys, it will doubtless cause words of sympathy for poor Jo dying as he did.

The Dugan, Harkins, and Rogers Family Founders of St. John the Evangelist Church, Zanesville

VI. John S. Dugan

John Simon Dugan, born about 1783 in Pennsylvania, married Barbara Caroline Schweitzer (1784-1867), daughter of Georg Ludwig and Anna (Kratz) Schweitzer. John was a hat maker in Brownsville, Pennsylvania, but gave up that trade and came to Zanesville to run the Green Tree Tavern at the northeast corner of Main and Fifth. He had purchased it in 1816 and took possession on his arrival in 1817.

According to the late Norris Schneider of Zanesville, the Dugans had to arrive in Zanesville by April 1, 1817 to complete John's purchase contract for the Green Tree. "At Cambridge, Ohio, a freshet had swollen the water of Wills Creek to flood stage. Crossing would be dangerous. But the date set for closing the deal on the tavern was April 1, and Dugan was determined to be on time." Dugan told their five-year old son, Lewis Henry, to hold his arms tightly around his waist and urged his intrepid German wife to follow. This she did, swimming her horse across the flooded creek, and they arrived in Zanesville in time to close the deal. Others place their arrival on St. Patrick's Day, 1817. Their household goods arrived a few days later via the keelboat *Hercules*.

The Green Tree was a two-story frame building that had been erected in 1805. To this Dugan added a three-story brick structure in 1823 that held a dining room, guest rooms, and Zanesville's first theater and auditorium. As mentioned above, John was instrumental in establishing the Catholic parish in Zanesville. (*Y Bridge City*, 90. *Catholic Home Companion. Bulletin*, Vol. I, pp 5-8 (Jan. 1975). *Zanesville Courier*, July 11, 1893. Goodspeed 476. Schneider, *Zanesville Times Recorder*, Dec. 12, 1982.)

John started a stagecoach line, which by 1825 consisted of six, four-horse teams and their drivers,

two old coaches, two one-horse sleighs, and one new coach body made in Pittsburgh. When Bishop Edward Fenwick returned from a trip to Rome, John Dugan was honored to convey him from Maryland to Ohio in his stagecoach. But near Cumberland, Maryland, while trying to control an unruly horse, Dugan was caught in the lines and dragged to his death. He died on March 11, 1825 and was brought back to Zanesville to be buried behind St. John the Evangelist Church. Some say that his remains were moved to St. Thomas Cemetery, but the obituary of his son Lewis H. Dugan in 1899 states that John's remains lie under St. Thomas Church. The discovery of young John A. Dugan's grave under the church in 1925 indicates that the family graves were not moved and it would be most fitting for the body of John S. Dugan to remain beneath the church that he was so instrumental in founding.

The only Ohio newspaper that survives that probably was on the route of John's stage line was the *Guernsey Times* of Cambridge. It did not mention John's demise. In fact, it often carried jokes that demeaned Irish immigrants. An issue was published on March 12, 1825 but the next was not until April 9. On the latter occasion the editor remarked that it had not been published for several weeks for want of paper. Paper had been purchased at Wheeling and was expected to be received for a March 19 issue, "but the great quantity of rain which has fallen for some weeks past rendered the roads so intolerably bad that they have been impassible for the stages. — The first stage however that ran from Wheeling brought us some paper..." This indicates the importance of Dugan's stage line, the difficulty of such an occupation in those days, and a probable factor that contributed to the accident that caused his death.

The widowed Barbara Dugan married James Taylor at St. John Church on November 29, 1832.

James was a wealthy developer at Duncan's Falls and Taylorsville (the present Philo). He became a Catholic and donated the lot for St. Ann's Church, Taylorsville. He lost his wealth, however, and died a relatively obscure man in 1854. Barbara moved back to the vicinity of Putnam about 1866 and died on November 16, 1867, aged 83. (*Signal*, Nov. 21, 1867) Her grave is in the old St. Thomas Cemetery. (For Mr. Taylor, see the *Bulletin*, Vol. XXXI, No. 12 (Dec., 2006))

A. Lewis Henry Dugan, only child of John and Barbara, was born in Brownsville, Pa. on July 10, 1812. He married Sarah Ann Culbertson on April 19, 1836 before Rev. S. H. Montgomery, O.P. They lived near Duncan's Falls for many years, where he was partner in a flour mill. Sarah died in 1841. (According to the *Catholic Telegraph* of January 27, 1844, she and her sister, Mrs. Rebecca Dunne, had been orphaned as children and were converts to the Faith. The *Zanesville Courier* of July 11, 1893 noted that she was a daughter of William Culbertson of Washington Township.) Lewis moved back to Zanesville in 1866 and was in the dry goods business with John C. English. About 1870 he bought a farm 1 1/2 miles southwest of the courthouse, where stood his elegant home, called Chestnut Hill Place. He died there on April 25, 1899.

1. James Taylor Dugan, baptized March 9, 1837, was buried from St. Thomas Aquinas on June 18, 1851.
2. John Simon Dugan, baptized November 7, 1838; sponsor was Mary Harkins. He was buried on October 3, 1841 from St. John the Evangelist Church.
3. Barbara Caroline (Carrie) Dugan, born in 1840, married William A. Fillmore (1840-1909) on Oct. 13, 1863 at St. Thomas Aquinas Church. William was a hardware dealer in Zanesville. She died on Feb. 12, 1931 and after a funeral at St. Thomas Church was buried on the Fillmore lot at Woodlawn Cemetery.

It is a sad commentary that John S. Dugan has no Catholic descendants (unless some might have joined the Church in recent days). Carrie had five children, but she married "Protestant money" and her only descendants living today are from her son Lewis Henry or Harry L. Fillmore, who was a Mason and was affiliated with the Methodist Church.

VII. Thomas Dugan "Irish"

Thomas Dugan, if he be a son of Thomas and Elizabeth, would fill out the number of their sons found in the 1800 census, but no evidence for or against the relationship has been found. He was born in County Donegal in 1784. According to information provided by his son Matthew in the 1883 history of Butler County, Pennsylvania, Thomas came to what became Oakland Township, Butler County, in 1798. He worked at the Bear Creek Furnace near Parker, for five years after his arrival in that vicinity. Parker is north of the Buffalo Creek Settlement.

Thomas married Grace O'Donnell, who also was a native of County Donegal, born in 1795.

Thomas is mentioned as "Thomas Dugan Irish" in the papers of the estate of another Thomas Dugan of Buffalo Creek, who was son of a Michael Dugan. The other Thomas boarded with Thomas Dugan Irish and Gracey early in 1825 and Gracey received the payment from the man's estate in 1827. Thomas Dugan Irish also bought three sheep from the estate.

Thomas eventually took up farming in Oakland Township. He was "a hard working man, strictly honest, and respected for many other good traits of character." He died on January 23, 1867 and is buried in St. Joseph Cemetery, Oakland Township. He and Gracey had ten children, and apparently one grandchild, by 1848.
